Application Process


Applicant **<u>must</u>** submit each of the following items considered:

- 1. Completed application form
- 2. EFC Score from your FAFSA (do not need the entire FAFSA, only the page with the EFC Score)
- 3. Two (2) letters of recommendation from your choice of high school teachers, administrators, counselors, employers, or individuals with significant knowledge of your experience and involvement. These must be current signed letters of recommendations.
- 4. An <u>official</u> and recent high school or college transcript with cumulative grade point average.
- 5. The ACT scorecard, the official SAT scorecard, or the WIN Career Readiness scorecard.

Check here if you are enrolled in a non-traditional curriculum or trade school. If so, you only need to submit items 1 & 3 above.
