	explanation of career goals and biographical (background) information, including school &			
	community activities.			
\Box 4.	Two (2) letters of recommendation (see attached form that must be completed) from your choice			
	of high school teachers, administrators, counselors, employers, or individuals with significant			
	knowledge of your experience and involvement. These must be current signed letters of			
	recommendations.			
□5.	An <u>official</u> and recent high school or college transcript with cumulative grade point average.
